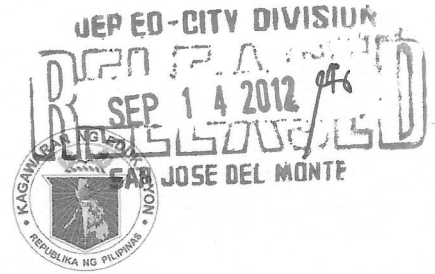

EVENT PROCEDURE

- I. Preliminaries
 1. Registration of Trainers and Participants
 2. Submission of required documents for the event
 3. Ocular inspection of the event venue
 4. Briefing / Orientation of trainers with the event administrators a day before the actual competition.
 5. Inspection and distribution of contest materials.

- II. Skills Exhibition Proper
 1. Briefing of trainers and participants with the event administrators.
 2. Inspection of event materials, tools and equipment.
 3. Orientation on the mechanics of the exhibit
 4. Other instructions.

- III. Materials, Tools and Equipment

All materials, tools and equipment should be provided by the participants (Descriptions will follow).

All inputs shall be endorsed to the secretary by the event Administrator.
All endorsed outputs shall be displayed until the duration of the event.
