

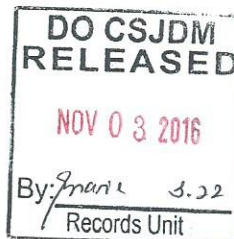

2016 CITY DIVISION ATHLETIC MEET

- Date and Place** – The Elementary and Secondary Levels, Public and Private Schools in the City Schools Division will hold the 2016 City Division Athletic Meet on November 14-18, 2016 at Graceville Elementary School to be hosted by UNIT 3.
- Sponsorship and Management** – The event will be sponsored by the DepEd, Division of City Schools, City of San Jose del Monte, in coordination with the Sangguniang Panglungsod, City Youth and Sports Development Office (CYSDO), all public elementary and secondary schools, and CSANPRISAA. 5. General Instructions & Guidelines, Events in the Sports Competition, Program of Activities, Officials of the Meet, Working Committee, Game Schedules, and Game Venues are found in Inclosures A, B, C, D, E, F, and G.
 6. The age qualification should be observed in all sports events. For Elementary athletes, not more than thirteen (13) years old. He/she should have been born on January 1, 2004 or after. For Secondary (JHS/SHS) athletes, not more than eighteen (18) years old. He/she should have been born on January 1, 1999 or after.
 7. **Screening of Athletes** – The following requires forms/documents should be screened by the Division Screening and Accreditation Committee at the Division Office on **November 7-9, 2016**, however, **documents of all athletes, coaches, and chaperons must be submitted to the Division Supervisor In-Charge of School Sports on or before November 4, 2016.**

Required documents for Coaches and Chaperons

 - 7.11. Sworn Statement (for Public Schools) / Affidavit (for Private Schools)
 - 7.12. Medical Certificate
 - 7.13. 4 pcs. Passport size identical pictures with name tag (Surname, First Name, Middle Initial) with white background
8. **Determination of Champion** – Champion to this Athletic Tournament will be determined by gold medal tally system.
 9. **Duties and Responsibilities** – Heads of Delegation, school heads, coaches, and chaperons are responsible for the age eligibility of athletes, discipline, and the observance of all rules and regulations governing the athletic meet.
 10. **Subsistence and Transportation** – Each participating delegation should take charge of the subsistence of their own contingent including game officials coming from each delegation. Expenditures of each school relative to these activities shall be charged against local fund/MOOE subject to usual accounting and auditing rules and regulations.
 11. **Attendance** – Teachers who are not assigned/designated coaches, chaperons, officials, working committee, and meet officials are expected to hold regular classes as usual.
 12. **Solidarity Meeting** – Meeting of tournament managers, officiating officials, coaches, and chaperons will be held on November 10, 2016, 1:00 pm at Graceville Elementary School.

RULES AND GUIDELINES ON PARTICIPATION, SCREENING AND ACCREDITATION OF ATHLETES, COACHES, AND CHAPERONS

1. Participants

- 1.1. Participants in the 2016 City Division Athletic Meet shall be elementary and secondary athletes from public and private schools who have participated in the school and district/unit/cluster meet: *Provided*, that, secondary athletes shall refer to both junior and senior high school students.
- 1.2. As a general rule, Kinder to Grade 6 athletes shall play in the elementary division, and Grade 7 to 12 athletes shall play in the secondary division. **However, elementary athletes who have been declared overage in the elementary level may be allowed to play in the secondary level.**
- 1.3. Athlete already graduated in the elementary level cannot play in the elementary division, even if he is still underage.

2. Eligibility of Athletes

(A) For Regular Sports Events:

- 2.1. A Filipino citizen.
- 2.2. Enrolled in a recognized school (schools with recognition/permit to operate) at the beginning of the current school year and have attended and/or completed the curriculum year.
- 2.3. For Elementary athletes, not more than thirteen (13) years old. He/she should have been born on January 1, 2004 or after.
- 2.4. For Secondary athletes, not more than eighteen (18) years old. He/she should have been born on January 1, 1999 or after.
- 2.5. Should have participated in the preliminary meets (Intramurals, District, Cluster, and Unit Meets)
- 2.6. Student-athletes who transferred from one region to another are allowed to participate: *Provided*, that their transfer was done before or at the beginning of the school year. Transferees from one division to another within the region are allowed to participate: *Provided*, that they have participated in the lower meets
- 2.7. As a general rule, elementary athletes shall play in the elementary division, and secondary athletes shall play in the secondary division.

(B) Paralympics:

- 2.1. A Filipino citizen.
- 2.2. Enrolled in Special Education (SPED) classes in a public or private school ***permitted or recognized by the DepED.***
- 2.3. Suffering from restriction or different abilities, as a result of a mental, physical or sensory impairment, to perform an activity in the manner or within the range considered normal for human being.
- 2.4. *Provided*, that the age categories for the Paralympics shall be (1) 15 years old and below; and (2) 16 to 25 years old.

3. Disqualifications

(A) For Regular Sports Events:

- 3.1. Athletes who have been declared over-age.
- 3.2. Elementary athletes with 3rd molar tooth.
- 3.3. Athletes with failing grades in more than two (2) learning areas in the 2nd grading period.
- 3.4. For Grades 11 and 12, 1st Semester Final Grade must not have two (2) or more failing grades in learning areas.
- 3.5. Athletes who become, have been, or are currently members of the National Team, National Training Pool, National Developmental Pool and who received or receiving monthly stipend and/or allowance from the PSC or played in the SEA Games: *Provided, However*, that those athletes who played in other foreign invitational competitions shall not be disqualified to play in the Palarong Pambansa: *Provided, Further*, that athletes participating in one sports discipline as members of the National Team, National Training Pool, National Developmental Pool receiving monthly stipend and/or allowance from the PSC or played in the SEA Games, Asian Youth Games, Asian Games and/or Olympic Games shall not be disqualified to play in

the Palarong Pambansa in a sports discipline other than the sports wherein the athlete participated in as member of the National Team, National Training Pool, national Developmental Pool and played in the SEA Games, Asian Youth Games, or Olympic Games.

- 3.6. Athletes who played in the SEA Games, Asian Youth Games, Asian Games and/or Olympics Games. *However*, athletes who played in foreign invitational competitions shall be disqualified to play in the Palarong Pambansa: *Provided*, that said invitational competition is not included in the above mentioned international games.
- 3.7. Athletes who failed to submit the required documents
- 3.8. Athletes banned during the previous Palarong Pambansa or disqualified during the lower meets.
- 3.9. Other grounds including, but not limited to falsification of documents, misrepresentation, and use of prohibited drugs.

(B) Paralympics:

- 3.1. SWD athlete who has been declared over-age.
- 3.2. SWD athlete who failed to submit the required documents.

4. Documentary Requirements for athletes

- 4.1. Athlete's Record (AR) signed by the athlete, coach, and authorized Division Sports Supervisor/Coordinator.
- 4.2. Original and certified photocopy of Birth Certificate issued by the National Statistics Office (NSO)/Local Civil Registrar. Late registration may be accepted: *Provided*, that the Birth Certificate was issued one (1) year prior to the current Palarong Pambansa.
- 4.3. In the case of foreign-born Filipino athletes, in lieu of NSO birth certificate, the original birth certificate issued by the country where he was born and a valid passport or a document issued by the Bureau of Immigration or Department of Foreign Affairs showing his or her nationality as a Filipino.
- 4.4. Form 137 with entries of Learner Reference Number (LRN), certified true copy from original or computer printed, duly signed by the Teacher-Adviser or Registrar or Principal or School Heads and by the authorized Division Sports Supervisor or Education Program Supervisor in-charge of sports.
- 4.5. For athletes who are enrolled under the alternative delivery mode (home study program or modified in school out school approach or open high school program), a copy of the numerical or descriptive rating equivalent to the second grading period of the regular classes should be submitted.
- 4.6. Certificate of Enrolment duly signed by the School Registrar or School Head.
- 4.7. Parent's or guardian's consent, verified by the Principal or Registrar or Teacher-Adviser.
 - 4.7.1. Designated legal guardians are those with court orders.
- 4.8. Medical Certificate issued within three (3) months from the date of submission and signed by a physician stating that the athlete is physically fit and within the age limit required. (The complete name of the signing physician shall clearly appear on the medical certificate, with the license number and date of examination.)
- 4.9. Dental Certificate with a universal entry, duly signed by a Dentist over his/her clearly printed name and license number, and with the date of examination should not be more than six (6) months prior to date of the opening of each level of competition.
- 4.10. Six (6) copies of passport size 1 ½ x 1 ½ identical and clear pictures with name tag (surname, first name, middle initial) and with grade level of the athlete [athletes' record, form 137, medical, dental, gallery, original BC].
- 4.11. Affidavit of the coach, attesting to the authenticity, validity, and correctness of the entries on the above-mentioned documents.
- 4.12. Additional documents for athletes in Special Sports Events for SWD:
 - 4.12.1. Intellectual Disability Certification – Psycho-Educational Assessment Tests conducted and certified by Psychologist or DepED SPED Supervisor indicating the athlete's IQ level (70 and below)
 - 4.12.2. Visual Impairment Certification – test conducted and certified by an Ophthalmologist to determine the visual acuity (Totally Blind or Low Vision)
 - 4.12.3. Hearing Impairment Certification – test conducted and certified by an Otorhinolaryngologist to determine that the athlete is unable to hear.

- 4.13. In case of athletes who wish to participate in arnis, boxing, taekwondo, wrestling, wushu, and gymnastics, a certification clearly identifying the specific and unique training requirements, years of relevant playing experience, competition track record, membership to relevant sports association. Additional medical records and such other requirements that will establish their physical and mental fitness, competence and ability to play their respective sports.

5. Eligibility and Documentary Requirements to be submitted by the Coaches, Assistant Coaches, and Chaperons

- 5.1. Training requirements – relevant sports training, 24 hours for non-combative and 40 hours for combative/gymnastics
- 5.2. Years of relevant experience – 1 year for non-combative and 2 years for combative
- 5.3. Track record – at least participated in the lower meets
- 5.4. Educational and professional background – at least K to 12 Sports Track Completer or 2nd year college sports related course
- 5.5. Membership in relevant sports associations – any relevant sports association
- 5.6. Necessary licenses or certifications – certification/accreditation issued by national/international sports association, authorized organization or by the DepED (Division, Region, of Central Office)
- 5.7. Medical records
- 5.8. Other requirements, including but not limited to, documents that will establish the coaches' competence, integrity and capability, and its legal relationship to the school and/or the athletes to show accountability.
- 5.9. Coaches and chaperons must be school or DepEd personnel.
- 5.10. Coaches and chaperons from private schools must have been in the service for at least one (1) year prior to current Palarong Pambansa.
- 5.11. Chaperons (if agreed and issued...)
 - 5.11.1. Relevant NURTURING training or experiences in accompanying female athletes
 - 5.11.2. Commitment that SHE will nurture female athletes only and not to coach athletes
- 5.12. Other eligibility that may be required by the Palaro Board.
- 5.13. Documents to be submitted:
 - 5.13.1. Certificate of Employment
 - 5.13.2. Form 212 (Personal Data Sheet)
 - 5.13.3. Four (4) copies of passport size 1 ½ x 1 ½ identical and clear pictures with name tag (certificate of employment, PDS, gallery, medical)
 - 5.13.4. Medical Certificate
 - 5.13.5. Duly sworn statement (for public schools) / Affidavit duly notarized (for private schools)
 - 5.13.6. Certification of SSS contributions for accountability. (for private schools)

6. Screening of Athletes

- 6.1. The Division Screening and Accreditation Committee (DSAC) shall:
 - 6.1.1. Receive all documents at least one (1) week before the start of the City Division Athletic Meet.
 - 6.1.2. Screen documents submitted by athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperons.
 - 6.1.3. Accredit qualified athletes, coaches, assistant coaches, and chaperons. (2 months submission of masterlists prior to regional meet/Palarong Pambansa)
 - 6.1.4. Consider replacement during screening
 - 6.1.5. Resolve protest.
- 6.2. Special Cases
 - 6.2.1. In case where there is discrepancy on the entry in the NSO and Form 137, the following documents shall be presented:
 - 6.2.1.1. In cases where there is discrepancy on the entry of name in the NSO and Form 137, the entry in the NSO shall prevail.
 - 6.2.1.2. Joint affidavit of two (2) disinterested persons certifying on the true date of birth.
 - 6.2.1.3. Local Civil Registry (LCR) issued Birth Certificate.
 - 6.2.2. In cases where the first or last name is not found at the top portion of the NSO but at the box below, the following shall be submitted:

- 6.2.2.1. Live Birth Certificate issued by the LCR.
- 6.2.2.2. Copy of the application/petition duly received by the LCR (supplemental reports to the LCR/Court)
- 6.2.2.3. Affidavit of parents
- 6.2.2.4. Affidavit of two (2) disinterested persons
- 6.2.3. When an illegitimate athlete uses the surname of his/her father, he/she shall submit an acknowledgment by the father, and an annotation on the NSO (subsequent marriage of the parents)
- 6.2.4. When the gender cannot be categorically determined, an affidavit of two (2) disinterested people shall be submitted.
- 6.2.5. Unreadable entries shall be supported by the original live birth certificate from the LCR.

7. Replacement of Athletes prior to the issuance of the Master list of Accredited Athletes

- 7.1. Replacement of the athletes may be allowed only before the final deliberation of athletes upon the written request signed by the coach and the head of the delegation, on the following grounds:
 - 7.1.1. Medical/health reasons
 - 7.1.2. Original athlete is not screened
 - 7.1.3. None or incomplete set of required document on the date set by DSAC.
 - 7.1.4. Original athlete is not eligible to play due to over-aged, impersonation, etc.

8. Protest on Eligibility

- 8.1. Protest shall be in writing and duly signed by the coach and the head of the school or his/her official representative and shall be filed before the start of the second game of the concerned team with the chair of the DSAC. Protest filed by other person shall be automatically dismissed without prejudice or refiling the same upon compliance of the above-mentioned requirement.
- 8.2. The Division Screening & Accreditation Committee may MOTU PROPIO conduct investigation if there is an obvious truth or merits of the allegation questioning the eligibility of the athlete.
- 8.3. Protest shall be accompanied by affidavit(s) of witness(es) and evidence(s) to support thereof.
- 8.4. The protest shall be acted immediately by the DSAC upon receipt thereof. Decision of the DSAC shall be appealable only to the Schools Division Superintendent.
- 8.5. Athletes who have been disqualified on the grounds provided in these rules may appeal the decision of the DSAC. However, the appellant cannot play pending the resolution of his appeal.
- 8.6. The protestant shall have the burden of proving his allegations and shall provide necessary evidence (documentary/testimonials), otherwise, the protest will be dismissed "MOTU PROPIO".
- 8.7. The DSAC may also conduct investigation on complaint/s of misinterpretation, impersonation, and violations of similar nature, for purposes of determining the eligibility of the athlete without prejudice of filing administrative and criminal action.

9. Sanctions

- 9.1. Any violation of the rules on eligibility is punishable by lifetime ban from participating in school sports competition without prejudice to the filing of appropriate administrative and criminal charges against erring officials and athletes.
- 9.2. When a violation on eligibility rules is proven in team competitions, the games in which the individual has taken part shall be declared forfeited in favour of the opposing team. The individual performance, in case of individual event shall be nullified.
- 9.3. With respect to sanctions that will be imposed against individuals who caused the violation of the rules on eligibility, he/she may be suspended from participating in future school sports competitions, the duration of which shall be one (1) to three (3) years depending on the gravity of the offense: *Provided*, that he/she shall suffer the penalty of perpetual disqualification from participating in any future school sports competition in case of violations which are intentional and wilful.
- 9.4. These sanctions shall be without prejudice to the filing of appropriate administrative and/or criminal charges against the erring officials and/or athletes in accordance with existing laws, rules and regulations.

10. Ground Rules

- 10.1. Rule 9.1 shall be strictly enforced against erring coach; however, one (1) year suspension to play in any event shall be enforced against erring athletes.
- 10.2. Athletes included in the official list of qualified athletes in higher level athletic meet, but refuse to play without valid reason will be penalized by one (1) year suspension to play in any event the following school year. Likewise, the same sanction will be enforced to the school, if the school failed/did not allow the athlete to participate in the said athletic meet.
- 10.3. A comprehensive preliminary screening of athletes' documents shall be the main responsibility of the Head of Delegation. No athlete shall be recommended by the School Heads without having been validated by the Unit/Cluster/School Committee on Sports.
- 10.4. Head of Delegations and School Heads will be held liable to any discrepancies on their athletes' eligibility.
- 10.5. Head of Delegations and School Heads will be held liable to any inappropriateness on their coaches' and athletes' behaviour.
