# WHEELS OF HOPE: ONE PUSH FOR EDUCATION

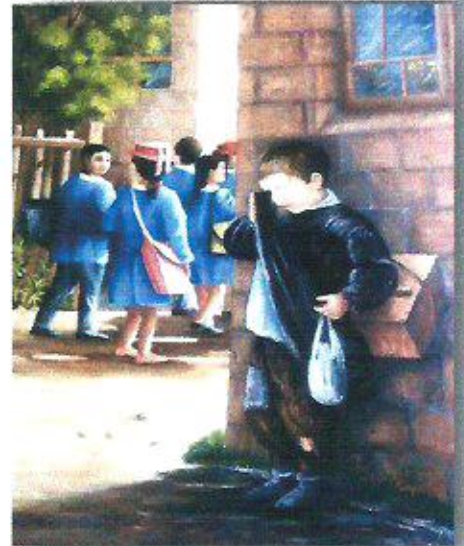
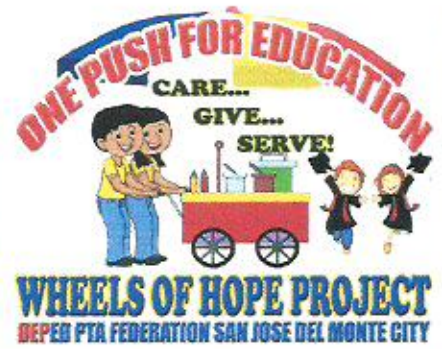
is a collective response to eradicate drop-out and incidence of failing students in the City Division of San Jose del Monte through entrepreneurial engagement and local scholarship program.

- ◆ The **PTA Federation** with the help of other stakeholders and sponsors shall support the **parents** and **Students-at-Risk of Dropping Out (SARDOs)** and **Out of School Children and Youth (OSCY)** to hurdle the financial challenges of basic education by providing financial assistance to students and food cart livelihood program for parents.
- ◆ Volunteer teachers, spearheaded by Araling Panlipunan and HUMSS, and those with National Certificates in TESDA technical-vocational training shall serve as Trainers in this project.
- ◆ Parents and students beneficiaries shall undergo various seminars and continuous skills training coupled with values and

**WHY?** Our project is an answer to the 2016 Annual Poverty Indicators Survey which revealed that one in every 10 Filipino kids or about 10 percent of the 39 million Filipinos with age range six to 24 years old are out-of-school youth (OSY). We must do our part in solving this problem.

**HOW?** The **PTA FED** shall provide the **Food Cart** and all products therein. The **Parent Partner** shall sell the products. The Net Income shall be divided on 50-50 basis between the seller and the PTA Fed.

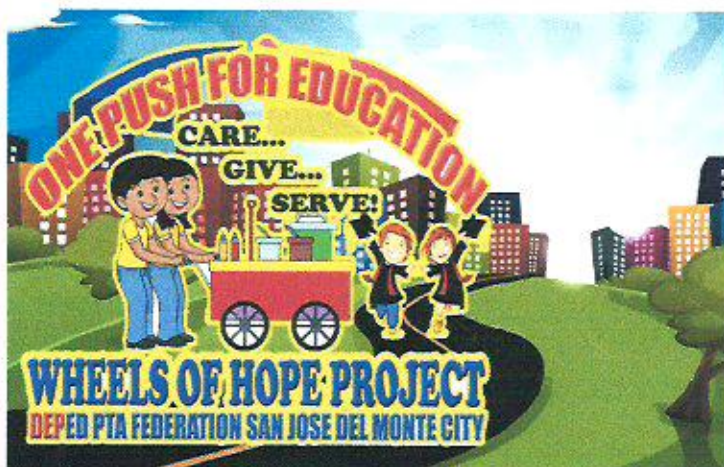
- 50% of the proceeds shall be the salary of the Parent Partner while that of the PTA FED shall then be used for the daily scholarship assistance for student /OSY beneficiaries.
- The PTA Fed establishes a Center within the target community for training, production and continuous education of member beneficiaries.
